

Your annual dues notice is enclosed with this newsletter to save mailing costs, since one mailing to the members costs about \$20.00 and we hope to keep our chapter dues down to \$4.00 as long as possible. Last year National dues went up one dollar. Now this year the State Board of Management at its annual meeting in September approved an assessment of \$1.00 per member as a one-time charge to balance the current budget. This assessment of \$1.00 applies to all members including life members.

Try to pay your dues as promptly as possible, preferably not later than the 31st of December 1978. The membership roster along with all State and National dues must be forwarded in January. Any dues not in by that time necessitates red-lining that name on the list. Dues received later requires that the Chapter Secretary reinstate that member, however he may fail to get the first 1979 issues of both the State and National Magazines since: (1) The roster forwarded with the dues is used to prepare the membership directory in the Winter Issue of the Pennsylvania Minuteman and (2) The roster is used to update the mailing lists of both State and National magazines.

To save both time and money, membership cards are being mailed along with the dues notices to those who paid earliest last year.
