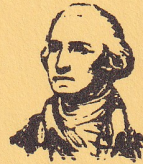

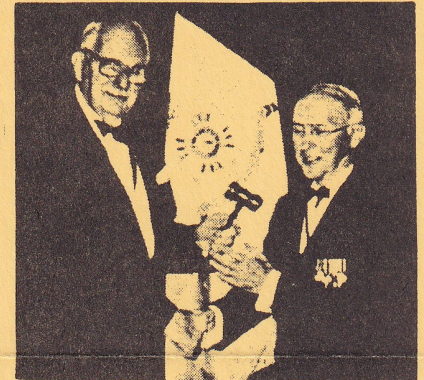

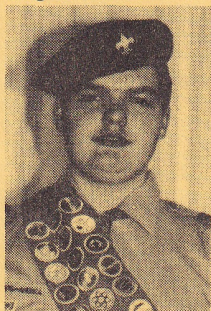

CARLISLE EAGLE SCOUT IS AREA WINNER IN SAR COMPETITION

Eagle Scout Richard Thomas Probst, 15, of Carlisle Troop 295, son of Dr. and Mrs. Reed R. Probst, of 1116 Stratford Drive, Carlisle, has been adjudged the area winner of the SAR competition, among the 85 new Eagle Scouts in 1984 of the Keystone Area Council of BSA.

He will be awarded a Good Citizenship Medal by Harris Ferry Chapter on February 17, at the DAR-SAR George Washington Dinner, at the West Shore Country Club, and as the local winner will be a finalist in the statewide competition and a possible contender for the \$2,000 national scholarship offered by NSSAR.

Probst, with a background of seven years in scouting, attained his Eagle rank last July 17, having some 31 merit badges, half again as many as the number required for Eagle status. He is a 10th-grade student at the Carlisle Intermediate High School. His father Dr. Probst, is Head of Intelligence at the U.S. Army War College.

The guest speaker for this year's George Washington Dinner will be James F. Davis, who for the past two years has served as Executive Director of the Historical Society of Dauphin County. He will speak on plans for this year's observance of Dauphin County's Bicentennial.
