J. Alan Gardocky, Harrisburg, by trf. from Cleveland.

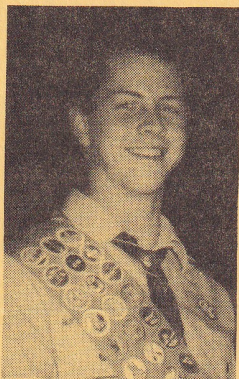
Col. John E. Bex, Mechanicsburg, by trf. from the Blair County Chapter.
