"THOMPSON'S BATTALION" IS TOPIC OF SEPTEMBER MEETING

Mark O. Hagenbuch, Dillsburg school principal who has gone to great lengths to promote public recognition for the Pennsylvania unit which had the distinction of being the first to become a part Washington's continental army in 1775, will be guest speaker at our quarterly dinner meeting on Thursday evening, September 14, at the Officers Club at Carlisle Barracks.

Hagenbuch has led his students in various useful community activities to raise money for erection of historical markers for the local companies of Thompson's Battalion, thus, at the same time, stimulating the students' interest in their historical heritage.

The speaker is an alumnus of Lock Haven and Bucknell universities, and a director of the Thompson's Battalion Memorial Project.

It was several years ago, when he was a teacher in a Dalmatia school, that he first undertook to encourage student interest in historical markers, and now he continues in such activities with the Dillsburg students.
