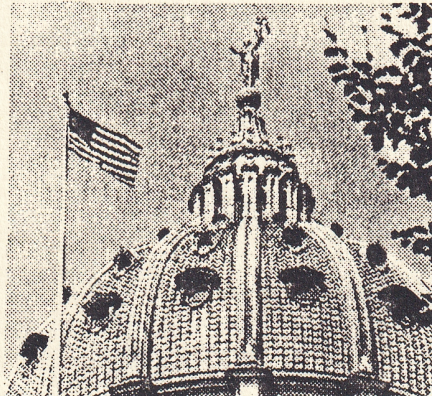
## State to Fly 13-Star Flag on June 14

IN OBSERVANCE OF FLAG DAY, a 13-star American Flag will again be flown from the main flagpole atop the Pennsylvania State Capitol Building on Thursday, June 14 — the 213th anniversary of the official adoption of "the Stars and Stripes" as our national ensign by the Second Continental Congress at Philadelphia in 1777.

The 10-foot nylon flag being used is the one presented to the Commonwealth for this purpose by the Harris Ferry Chapter.

In further observance of the date, the Harris Ferry Chapter will meet jointly with the Harrisburg Chapter of DAR at a Flag Day Luncheon on June 14, at the West Shore Country Club.

The guest speaker at the luncheon will be Mark O. Hagenbuch, of Dillsburg, with a visual presentation on "Flags of the American Revolution." Hagenbuch last September was recipient of an SAR Good Citizenship Medal for his activities in stimulating student interest in local history, pertaining to the American Revolution.
