TWO CHAPTER EVENTS BEING HELD HERE DURING FEBRUARY THIS YEAR

State Meeting Feb. 4-5 Annual Geo. Washington At Penn-Harris Center Event Sunday, Feb 20th

The February quarterly meeting of the Pennsylvania State Society of SAR, being held Friday evening and Saturday morning and afternoon (Feb. 4-5) at the Penn-Harris Convention Center, is being hosted by Harris Ferry Chapter. Accordingly, it is hoped that many chapter members and their wives will attend.

Friday Evening (Feb 4), a Wine and Cheese Reception will be held from 8 to 10 in the Veranda Room of the Penn-Harris, to receive out-of-town guests from other chapters. For that, a speaker from the Pennsylvania State Museum will give a slide presentation on "Pennsylvania Capitals: 3 Cities, 3 Centuries," the title of a special exhibit currently being featured at the museum.

Saturday Morning, from 9:30 to 11:30, a special training session for SAR members will be held in Keystone meeting rooms of the Convention Center, and as a special program for the women, a tour of the State Museum is scheduled for that period, with chartered bus transportation provided between hotel and museum.

The **PASSAR Luncheon**, open to all SAR members and guests, will be held from 12:30 to 1:30, in the Keystone D Dining Room of the Convention Center.

Immediately following the luncheon, the PSSAR will hold its Winter business meeting, in an adjacent room, from 1:30 until 3:30. This too will be open to any members or guests wishing to attend.

The annual George Washington meeting, co-sponsored by the Harrisburg chapters of DAR and SAR, this year will be in the nature of an afternoon *brunch*, on Sunday, February 20, at 12:45, at the West Shore Country Club, Camp Hill.

"George Washington in Harrisburg" will be the topic of the guest speaker, Peter S. Seibert, former executive director of the Historical Society of Dauphin County, and now director of The Heritage Center of Lancaster County. He had been scheduled to speak on the same subject at last year's Washington dinner, which was cancelled due to blizzard conditions.

This being the year for the event to be sponsored by the DAR chapter, the reservations (at \$17.50 per serving) are being handled by the chapter treasurer, Mrs. Janet P. Reinhardt, of Dillsburg.

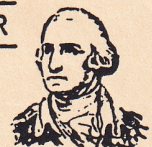
