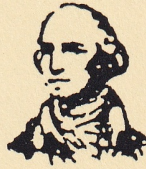

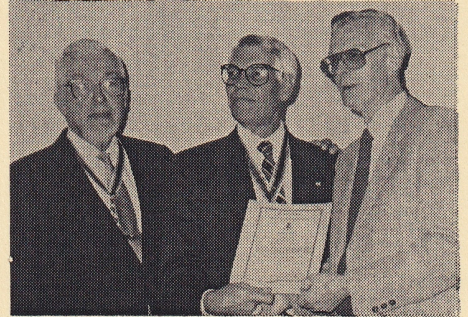

Military Historian This Year's Speaker

Chapter Honors Winner of Eagle Competition

Eagle Scout Matthew J. Orlowski, 17, a Senior at Central Dauphin High School and a member of Harrisburg Scout Troop No. 302 -- as area winner of the 1994 SAR Eagle Scout Competition -- will receive an SAR *Good Citizenship Medal* at the George Washington Dinner. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. John J. Orlowski, of 4444 Mars Ave., Harrisburg 17112, also attending the dinner as guests of the chapter.



David E. Hartman, chairman of Harris Ferry Chapter's Eagle Scout Committee, said that Orlowski was the winner among the 12 area Eagles who competed in the 1994 contest, of the 112 new Eagles of the four-county area who received SAR Recognition Certificates from the chapter on November 22, at the 20th Annual Eagle Recognition Dinner of Keystone Area Council, Boy Scouts of America.

As area winner of the 1994 competition, Orlowski is a contender for the Bronze Eagle trophy offered by the State SAR, and perhaps for a national scholarship.

"Washington and the Whiskey Rebellion" will be the topic of Col. Martin W. Andresen, retired former Deputy Director of the Army's Military History Institute at Carlisle Barracks, in addressing this year's DAR-SAR Washington Dinner.

The Whiskey Rebellion, the 200th anniversary of which was celebrated in Carlisle last October, was historically significant in two respects. It marked the first great test of Federal authority under the new U.S. Constitution, and was the first and only time an American President ever took to the field in command of troops to enforce a principle of law.

A West Point graduate, born in Georgia and reared in Iowa, Col. Andresen spent the last 11 years of his military career at the Carlisle institute, and, in retirement, continues to serve there as a consultant.

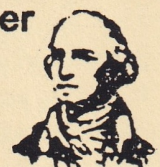
