### Harris Ferry to Honor 100 New Eagle Scouts

About 100 new Eagle Scouts of the four-county area will be awarded SAR certificates by Harris Ferry Chapter on November 25, when they attend the 23rd Annual Eagle Recognition Dinner of Keystone Area Council of Boy Scouts of America, at the Radisson Penn-Harris Convention Center, Camp Hill.

David E. Hartman, chairman of the chapter's Eagle Scout Committee, said the scouts will also receive kits containing full details concerning the yearly scholarship program sponsored by SAR nationally.

He noted that this is the 13th year of Harris Ferry Chapter's local sponsorship of the Eagle Scout competition, in which scholarships totalling \$6,000 are awarded nationally in addition to various state and local medals and prizes.

### Chapter Observes 210th Year of US Constitution

September 17 this year marks the 210th anniversary of signing of the U.S. Constitution by delegates at the convention held in Philadelphia in 1787, as later ratified by the several states in March 1789.

An historic first step toward establishment of constitutional government in America was adoption of the Mayflower Compact in 1620 by the Pilgrims of Plymouth, Massachusetts. To present that aspect of the story we are pleased to have as our speaker this year Stacy B. C. Wood, Jr., of Lancaster, deputy governor of the Pennsylvania Society of Mayflower Descendants and regent of its Susquehanna Colony.

He will illustrate his talk with excerpts from "The Mayflower Pilgrims," a film produced by the National Society.
